## Licensed School Age After-School Child Care Compass Zone



### Purpose of the CompassZone Program

The purpose of the Plymouth Boys & Girls Club CompassZone Program is to provide a safe, caring environment for children outside the home and beyond school hours.

Our program provides a wholesome environment that promotes social, physical, and character development, as well as supplementing parents' and schools' efforts to meet children's intellectual and educational needs.

The School Age Child Care Program is operated by The Boys & Girls Club of Plymouth. It is a fee-based program that provides children ages 6 to 13 with enrichment opportunities from the close of school until 5:30 pm. After 5:30 p.m., members may join other club programs.

The head administrator is the Executive Director of the Club, who will staff the program with certified and qualified individuals, maintaining ratios and standards that meet or exceed all licensing requirements for the Massachusetts Office of Early Education and Care (EEC). Staff are college graduates.

### LATE FEES

Weekly payments for CompassZone  
are due on Thursday before the scheduled week.  
There is a \$10 fee for late payments.

Late pick up fee will be charged after at 7:40 PM.  
\$1.00 per minute for every minute a Compass Zone  
member is picked up after 7:40 pm. The extra charge  
pays for staff overtime.

Our Compass Zone After-School program  
is an on-going, semester-long program.

HOMEWORK HELP, PHYSICAL  
ACTIVITIES, BRAIN-GAIN, NUTRITION

Compass Zone is a cooperative  
venture between the Club and the  
parents of member children. As such,  
our After-School program is dependent  
upon both good will and a recognition  
that planning and staffing require  
advance notice of absences and  
childrens' needs.

Program slots in Compass Zone are  
reserved for each child. Staff, tutoring  
specialists, and resources are  
determined by the number of children  
registered in this program. Enrollment  
in the After-School program requires  
parents to pay the full After-School fee  
each week, regardless of whether the  
child/children attended the program  
for the day or the week.
